The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest award a Girl Scout can earn. Earning this award symbolizes outstanding accomplishments in leadership, advocating for others and personal development. During this training workshop, experienced advisors will guide girls through the award requirements and project planning to help them develop a leadership project that will benefit others in the community. This training is *mandatory* for all girls interested in earning the Girl Scout Gold Award.

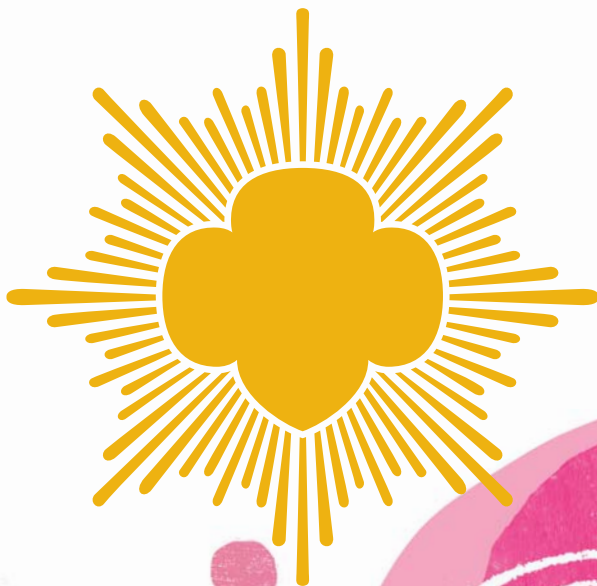
Girl Scout Gold Award Interviews

Grades 9-12

Girls going for the Girl Scout Gold Award must meet with the Girl Scout Gold Award Committee for a first and final interview. A girl cannot begin her project until she receives approval from the council. For project approval, submit a Project Proposal to the council three weeks prior to the preferred pre-scheduled interview date. Submit Final Report forms three weeks prior to the preferred pre-scheduled interview date for final project approval. Final paperwork must be received by February 1, 2015 to be recognized at the 2015 Girl Scout Award Celebration.

Counselor-In-Training (CIT)

Entering grades 10-12 in summer 2015

Event Pathway

Event Program Aide

Grades 6-12

Girls rotate through various stations, with each station focusing on a specific project or skill. Teen girls lead or assist at these stations. Teens need to be at least two years older than the girls they are working with and don't pay registration fees to attend. Events on pp. 7-32 with this symbol provide that great opportunity.
