Girls can *Take Action* by impacting and benefiting communities in a greater way than ever before to make our world a better place. By going on a Girl Scout Journey or earning the Girl Scout Bronze, Silver, or Gold Awards, girls will:

- · Investigate issues in their community
- Identify and understand the root cause of these issues
- Develop a Take Action project that tackles an issue that is meaningful to them

Girls track the success of their project in a measurable way and gain an understanding by finding a way to ensure that the project creates lasting change, not only for the moment, but for the future as well. These three characteristics: **root issue**, **measurable**, **sustainable**, are what differentiate Take Action projects from community service projects.
