Adult Volunteer Details

This day camp is 100% organized and facilitated by adult volunteers. Spend quality time with your Girl Scout and spend a day (or five!) helping her and her friends. Volunteer at camp this year and see what all the excitement is about!

- ❖ The girls need you! One adult volunteer is needed for every 5-8 girls during each day of camp. That means **each family should register at least one adult for at least one day** during camp to help.
- ❖ Volunteers don't have to be moms – dads, grandparents, family friend, young adult volunteers. Girl Scout alums and more are welcome!
- ❖ Adults are needed for camper overnights (for girls entering grades 4-6 in the fall).
- ❖ Peewees (ages 3-5) and boys (ages 6-12) are welcome on days parent/guardians are volunteering (fee: \$15/day).

Pre-camp orientations: Adult volunteers (new and returning) should plan on attending our training and orientation meeting on Sunday 8/6/23 at 1:30 p.m.- 3:30 p.m. at Camp Silver Brook to get an understanding of what the week of camp will be like.
