Which camp is right for you?

GSWISE Day Camp

Day camp sessions in East Troy last for five days. Campers enjoy camp during the day and then go home to sleep at night. Each session has a fun theme, like art, STEM, nature, performing arts, or sports and games.

Camp Alice Chester Overnight Camp

These sessions in East Troy are two or more nights long. Campers sleep in a troop house, A-frame cabin, or a platform tent. Campers enjoy classic camp activities like swimming, boating, art n' crafts, nature exploration, sports and games, and more, all based on that week's theme. Teen campers can expand their leadership with our Counselor-In-Training sessions.

Camp Alice Chester Adventure Trips

These trips last for three nights or more. Campers will learn about a special interest or high adventure skill, like paddling, horseback riding, climbing, and more. They may stay at camp the entire session or they may leave for a day or more, depending on the level of the trip.

Day Camps by Community

Sessions at these completely volunteer-led camps last five days and take place in East Troy, West Bend, Waukesha, or Kenosha. They're a great way to join your local Girl Scout community. During the week, campers participate in activities that build on each other, so they can learn new skills as they grow.

Grownups can join the fun too! Volunteer for a day or more at camp with your camper to help make camp the best experience for everyone.

CampHERO

This five-night camp is for campers in grades 7-12 who want to learn what it's like to be a first responder. Campers get hands-on training from real police officers, firefighters, and EMS workers. During the day, campers learn and practice skills at the Milwaukee Area Technical College Oak Creek campus, and at night, they stay indoors at Camp Alice Chester in East Troy.

Who Can Be A Girl Scout

Girls in grades K5-12 throughout southeastern Wisconsin can be Girl Scout members. Adults who are 18 or older can join too as adult members. All members follow the Girl Scout Promise and Law, which remind us to be kind to others, respect ourselves, make the world a better place, and so much more.

This Girl Scout membership year is from October 1, 2025 - September 30, 2026. To help keep everyone safe, adults who volunteer with Girl Scouts must be registered members and pass a background check. Once you register, you're covered by the basic Girl Scouts of the USA insurance plan.

Girl Scout Membership

\$70 per Girl Scout

Any non-Girl Scout campers* are encouraged to pay the \$70 membership registration fee to become a Girl Scout and enjoy all of the benefits of being a Girl Scout member through September 30, 2026! New members can participate in troops or as an Individually Registered Member, attending special events, learning experiences, and more!



How to Register for Camp Sessions

You can register starting Monday, November 17, **2025 at noon.** *Make sure your browser is updated.* To register on mobile devices, download CampMinder's Campanion app for best results. Using the app, you can register, complete forms, and



Step 1: Confirm membership registration or opt for

non-member registration fee

- If campers are not currently registered and want to become a Girl Scout member, visit www.gswise.org to join. Select Join Us on the website to begin your registration process.
- If your camper is a previous Girl Scout whose membership has lapsed, go to myGS to renew their membership.
- Campers who choose not to register as a member will be charged the non-member session fee, which includes a Girl Scout membership.
- If you do not register as a member within one month of registering for camp, you will be charged the non-member
- All adults volunteering must be a registered member and have a current, approved background check on file for the safety of all campers.

Step 2: Visit www.qswise.org/summercamp or the Campanion app to register for your camp session(s).

Step 3: You must go back in and complete all required forms including transportation, health history, etc. Registration is not confirmed until all forms are completed.

Camp Payment Options

- You can reserve a spot by paying in full OR paying the minimum deposit required: \$25 for Day Camps or \$50 for Overnight Camp. All camp balances will be automatically charged on **June 1, 2026.** Waitlisted campers are not charged until they are promoted off the wait list.
- You can use Program Activity Credits (PACs), (if they are not expired), toward the session fee. PACs cannot be used to pay for camp deposits. Girl Scouts earn PACs by participating in the Girl Scout Cookie Program or Fall Product Program.
- Camp registrations received after **June 1, 2026** will automatically be charged two weeks prior to the session if they are not paid in full at time of registration.
- You can apply for a camp scholarship, if needed. If the cost of camp remains beyond your financial capacity, we invite you to apply for a needs based camp scholarship. Please pay the required minimum deposit and then request a camp scholarship application in CampMinder. You will receive a form through email that you must complete to

process your request. We keep all requests confidential. If you do not receive a form in your email, please reach out to customercare@aswise.ora.

Waitlists

If a session is filled or closed, you can put your camper on a waitlist. You will be contacted if a spot opens up. For Day Camp by Community, campers will be removed from the waitlist once an adult registers to volunteer and the camp director confirms this.

Many Day Camps by Community need an adult from each family to register to volunteer for one day before they can register their camper(s). This makes sure that there will be enough adult coverage for all campers. If a troop is attending, there needs to be adequate coverage each day in order for the campers from that troop to be removed from the waitlist. Adults must be a currently registered Girl Scout and have a current, approved background check.

Get Ready for the Wild West!

Saddle up for the best summer ever at Day Camp! Each day will be filled with exploring the great outdoors, laughter, and activities as big as the open range. From games under the summer sun to crafty creations, you'll find plenty of fun on the trail. Dust off your boots, grab your hat and sunscreen, and get ready for an adventure you won't forget!

Day Camps are held for communities throughout southeastern Wisconsin for five days at Camp Alice Chester, Camp Silver Brook, Chinook Program Center, or Trefoil Oaks Program Center. Each camp is run by adult volunteers and led by teens who are committed to giving local Girl Scouts the best outdoor experience.

What new skills will campers learn?

Camp activities are age-based and progressive. This means that younger campers start off with easier and more manageable versions of certain camp activities like outdoor skills, archery, and boating. Progressive activities give campers an opportunity to build up their skills and confidence before aging into more challenging activities.

Here's an example: To teach targeting skills, Girl Scout Daisies or Brownies may learn how to use sling shots, Girl Scout Brownies or Juniors may learn how to target the bullseye with bows and arrows, and older Girl Scouts may perfect their skills with hatchet throwing.

General information

Campers in grades K4-6:

The fee includes a T-shirt, patch, busing, activities, and some meals/snacks. Most camps allow campers in K4 to attend camp. Check your specific camp's page at www.gswise.org/daycampsbycommunity for age requirements.





Program Aides (PAs)/Counselors-in-Training (CITs) Girl Scouts in grades 7–12:

Do not pay a camp fee. They receive the patch, busing, and some meals/snacks.

Peewees (ages 3-5) and boys (ages 6-12):

\$15 per day; can only attend on the day the parent/guardian volunteers at camp. Qualifications vary for each camp. Please visit *www.gswise.org/daycampsbycommunity* for details. Please make sure the child is ready to be away from the adult and spend a day at camp with their own group.

Adult Volunteers:

Do not pay a camp fee. Receive the patch (if desired), busing, and some meals/snacks. Each adult volunteer on site must be a registered Girl Scout member and have a current approved background check.

PAs/CITs

No fee for members; non-members will pay a \$90 fee, which includes a Girl Scout membership.

Registration Deadlines

Please note that late registration varies for each camp and can only be taken if space and adult coverage allows.

Overnights/Late Nights

Camps may offer an overnight or late night option for some campers/PAs/CITs for an additional \$20/night fee.

Volunteers Make Day Camps by Community Possible

Adults from each household are needed to volunteer one (or more!) days!

Day Camps by Community are run by volunteers - including parents and caregivers like you! For each day of camp, one adult is needed for every five to eight campers to follow Girl Scouts' camper to adult ratio. This means each family or troop needs an adult to volunteer one or more days to help keep camp safe and fun. For some camps, Girl Scouts may be put on a waitlist until a family member or troop volunteer signs up.

How to Register to Volunteer

- Step 1: Register as a member of Girl Scouts at www.gswise.org and complete an online background check.
- Step 2: Register for the camp session your camper will attend. Go to *www.gswise.org/summercamp*. Choose grade 12+.

Adults who are not already a registered member will need to pay the \$30 membership fee. The membership is good through September 30, 2026 and includes your background check and Girl Scout insurance while participating at camp, in events, or with your troop.

The Magic of Volunteering

Troop leaders: Volunteering gives you a chance to learn new skills to use with your troop during the school year. Plus, you'll learn lots of songs, games, and skills the Girl Scouts can enjoy at troop meetings.

Caregivers and family members: Volunteering gives you special time with your camper to watch their independence and grow.



What does my day look like when I volunteer?

Show up ready for fun! You will be assigned to be part of a unit or at an activity station with other adults, CITs, and PAs. You will be given a schedule, map of camp, and resource binder. The CITs and PAs know their way around camp and will help lead activities and get you where you need to be.

Your time will be spent:

- Helping your unit prepare their lunch when cooking over a fire (we have online and in-person outdoor cooking training and the PAs/CITs can assist with this)
- Helping campers choose an activity to do during free time (many camps have pre-assembled activity kits and a manual with free-time activities)
- · Assisting campers getting to activities on time
- · Making sure everyone is included
- · Helping campers make new friends
- Encouraging campers as they try new activities

You don't need to be an experienced camper—your role will help campers enjoy camp, have fun, explore, and discover new possibilities. And of course, we want you to have fun too!

All camps offer a volunteer orientation. We want to make sure you feel comfortable when you are at camp, and we will answer all of your questions before your camp begins.

Keeping Camp Safe

Camper safety is the most important thing at summer camp. Here's how we keep campers safe:

- Each camp has a health supervisor on staff all day and a first aider for each overnight.
- Swimming and boating activities are supervised by trained, certified lifeguards.
- Archery instructors are trained and certified by national archery organizations.
- Camps are licensed and inspected by state health inspectors.
- Weather is watched closely, and there are plans for hot days, storms, or emergencies.
- Camp directors are volunteers and trained in child development, leadership development, emergency procedures, Girl Scout programs, outdoor skills, and more.
- All adult volunteers are registered members and complete a criminal background check and take child abuse prevention training.

Teen Girl Scouts Needed!

Teen Girl Scouts help younger campers get out of their comfort zones and try new things. We'll give you the training you need to become a role model for younger Girl Scouts.

Bonus service hours You can earn 35+ service hours in one week! Girl Scouts can also work towards or earn the Program Aide pin or Community Service to Girl Scouting bar by volunteering at Girl Scout summer camp.

How you will help:

Program Aide-in-Training (PAIT) (Girl Scouts in grade 6): See what being a Program Aide (PA) is all about as you shadow the PAs and try leading younger campers in activities. PAITs pay camper fee.

Program Aide (PA) (Girl Scouts in grades 7-9): Lead younger campers as you become a leader. Work with an adult mentor to improve your skills.

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) (Girl Scouts in grades 9-12): Master your skills by leading activities or a unit.

PAs and CITs do not pay the session fee, but pay a fee for any overnights/late nights.

How teen Girl Scouts sign up:

- Step 1: Make sure you are a registered Girl Scout before you start your Summer Camp 2026 registration, if you want to attend camp for free and avoid the non-member fee, which includes a Girl Scout membership. Join, renew, or check your membership status at www.gswise.org.
- Step 2: Register for your camp session at *www.gswise.org/ summercamp* beginning November 17 at noon.
- Step 3: Attend PA Core training or CIT training if you haven't already.
- Step 4: Attend camp training.

GSWISE Day Camp

GSWISE Day Camp lasts five days in East Troy. Each camp has a fun theme: Arts, STEM, Nature, 4th of July, Cooking, and Crafts. It's a great chance to try new things! Trained staff will lead campers in hands-on activities where they can learn, build confidence, and make new friends.

Bonus service hours: You can earn 35+ service hours in one week! Girl Scouts can also work towards or earn the Program Aide pin or Community Service to Girl Scouting bar by volunteering at Girl Scout summer camp.

How you will help:

Program Aide-In-Training (PAIT) (Girl Scouts in grade 6): Start your leadership journey by completing Program Aide Training, shadowing the Program Aides in assisting in a unit, and leading an activity or two for younger campers. Girl Scouts pay the camper fee. Campers who are in this program complete the PA training requirement for next summer.

Program Aide (PA) (Girl Scouts in grades 7-8): Lead younger campers as you become a leader. Work with an adult mentor to improve your skills. Offered during all sessions. No fee.

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) (Girl Scouts in grades 9-12): Master your skills by leading activities or a unit. Offered during all sessions. No fee.

PA/CIT Training

If you will be a new PA/CIT in 2026, you must attend PA/CIT training sometime this year.

Look for the training dates in the Fall/Winter and Winter/Spring Program Guides. If you were a PAIT at GSWISE Day Camp this past summer, you have completed this requirement.



Flexible pricing

Girl Scouts of Wisconsin Southeast helps cover some of the cost of summer camp. This means camp actually costs more to run than what families pay. For each session, there are two price options:

Tier 1 covers 75% of what it really costs to run camp for each camper. The prices for Tier 1 change depending on when you register: by December 20, from December 21 - March 1, and March 2 and on.

Tier 2 covers the full cost of running camp for each camper.

Choosing Tier 1 or Tier 2 will not change the fun or quality of camp. Flexible pricing helps make sure all campers can come and enjoy camp, no matter a family's financial situation. When you select a Tier 2 fee, you are investing in keeping the camp experience accessible for all current and future Girl Scouts.

The fee includes a T-shirt, patch, programming, and all meals/snacks.

Camp Scholarships Available

If camp costs more than your family can pay, apply for a camp scholarship. First, pay the required minimum deposit and then request a camp scholarship application in CampMinder. You will get a form by email that you need to fill out. All requests are private and kept confidential.

Non-Member Fees

Campers who are not registered Girl Scout members can opt to pay a higher non-member fee, which includes a Girl Scout membership. If you wish to avoid the non-member fee, please ensure your camper is a registered Girl Scout member within one month of registering for a camp session(s).

Who can attend Girl Scout summer camp?

Summer camp is open to all campers in grades K4-12. Campers who are not Girl Scout members can pay the \$70 membership registration fee and enjoy Girl Scout activities through September 30, 2026. Campers who choose not to register as a member will pay a higher session fee, which includes a Girl Scout membership.

What if my camper has special needs?

We are dedicated to serving all campers and can accommodate accordingly. Contact the camp director to learn how we can work with you and your camper to make the camp experience a success.

Are special dietary needs and allergies accommodated?

We want every camper to have the best camp experience and accomodate special needs. Contact the camp director so we can work together to make camp a fun and successful experience for your Girl Scout.

Can campers attend with a friend?

Yes! At Camp Alice Chester Overnight Camp, CampHERO, and GSWISE Day Camp, campers can be placed with a buddy. Buddies need to be in the same age group and sign up for the same session. Both friends should ask for each other by name when they register.

How is my child kept safe?

Your camper's safety is our #1 priority. We follow state licensing, ACA accreditation, and Girl Scout safety standards which include, but are not limited to:

- Background checks for all adult camp staff and volunteers
- Certified lifeguards, health supervisors, and highrisk activity instructors
- Training for all staff and volunteers to prioritize your camper's physical and emotional well-being

What if my camper gets sick at camp?

If a camper becomes ill or injured, camp staff will administer first aid and follow written procedures from the camp physician. If a camper's illness or injury is severe, they will be given emergency care at the scene and be transported to the hospital's emergency room.

When a camper becomes ill or injured, we notify caregivers of the camper's condition. In life threatening situations, treatment may begin before notification. This is noted on the health consent form.

What if my camper needs medication while at camp?

Our health staff and volunteers are prepared to dispense medication as needed. Medication must be in the original container with camper's name, name of medication and dosage instructions on the container and sent with an Authorization to Administer Medication form. This form is found in CampMinder.

Can campers bring a cell phone?

No. Our camps are unplugged to let campers connect with nature, peers, and themselves. The camp director will contact caregivers if a camper has a medical problem, is excessively homesick, or has an emergency.

How is weather handled at camp?

Camp activities might change with the weather. If it rains, storms, or gets too hot, campers might not be able to do certain activities. During severe weather, campers go to safe buildings where they can still have fun with games, STEM activities, or badge work.

What if my camper gets homesick?

Being homesick is a completely natural experience and is experienced by all campers on some level. Learning to cope with homesickness is a great life skill to learn, and we are well-equipped to help with this at camp! Staff receive extensive training on how to help campers cope with homesickness. Parents/guardians will be contacted about homesickness when deemed necessary.

How do I access camp confirmations?

For Camp Alice Chester Overnight Camp, CampHERO, and GSWISE Day Camp, confirmations are available in your CampMinder account or on your Campanion App. Day Camps by Community confirmations will be emailed by the volunteer camp directors two weeks before the camp session begins.
