

Code of Conduct for Program Aides (PAs) and Counselors-In-Training (CITs)

The adult leadership team (day camp directors and program aide coordinators) is responsible for the supervision of Program Aides and Counselors-In-Training, maintaining discipline, safety, and the day camp Code of Conduct.

- 1. The Girl Scout Promise and Law will be my guide throughout day camp. This means that cheating, stealing, dishonesty, swearing, vandalism, and/or fighting is inappropriate.
- 2. I agree to treat everyone with courtesy, respect individual differences, and do my best to make sure day camp is a positive experience for everyone.
- 3. I will abide by all camp rules.
- 4. I will set a good example by keeping myself neatly dressed and presentable and following the camp dress code. This includes covering cleavage, wearing longer shorts, and messages/logos on clothing are appropriate.
- 5. I will attend all scheduled programs, participating as required and cooperating with the adult leadership team. I will make sure an adult knows where I am at all times.
- 6. I will do my kaper duties as assigned, leaving each area better than I found it.
- 7. In consideration of others, and to perform at my best the next day, I agree to follow the established bedtime and sleep schedules if staying overnight.
- 8. I will be responsible for my personal belongings and equipment, keeping my things and area neat. I will not hold the Girl Scout council and/or day camp volunteers/staff responsible for their loss or damage due to my negligence or neglect.
- 9. I will demonstrate respect for group and camp property. I understand my parents/guardians and I are personally responsible for any loss, breakage, or vandalism of property that I cause.
- 10. I understand cell phones are not allowed during camp hours and will use only when given permission by camp directors.



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- 11. If I drive to camp, upon arrival I will turn in my keys to the designated person until I leave the property.
- 12. I understand I am not to have iPods, headsets, etc. on (or in my ears) during camp hours.
- 13. All of my medications (prescribed and over-the-counter) including vitamins and herbal supplements that I bring to camp will be checked in at first aid. I will not share any medicines with other teens or campers.
- 14. I understand the purchase and possession of fireworks and possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, vape pens, or illegal drugs are prohibited.
- 15. I understand the zero tolerance policy which includes hazing, foul language, physical violence, etc.
- 16. I will not bring any weapons to camp or use anything at camp as a weapon against someone else or myself.
- 17. I understand I am not to take pictures of campers and should not take or post pictures of others on social networking sites without their permission or if they are a minor their parent/guardian permission.
- 18. Romantic/sexual displays of affection or conversations about romantic/sexual relationships are not allowed at camp.
- 19. I will not physically injure myself or anyone else. I will not plan or take part in any pranks or jokes that are meant to embarrass, hurt, or insult.
- 20. I understand that all communication should first be to adults on site. I will not call home about problems without first communicating with onsite leadership.
