Dear Friends of Girl Scouts of Wisconsin Southeast,

What a year! Together, we've helped Girl Scouts throughout southeastern Wisconsin realize their own strengths, take on things they never thought possible, and grow into courageous, confident, and character-driven leaders. We are proud to share that we saw another year of membership growth, serving more than 12,400 girls and more than 6,100 adults, volunteers, and lifetime members. More than 2,000 of these girl members were served through our Community Outreach program—a 10-plus% increase compared to last year.

It was fitting that this year began with an incredible milestone: Camp Alice Chester's 100th anniversary. Our anniversary celebration brought together Girl Scouts from throughout the country and across generations. Seeing women share camp songs between reflections on how Girl Scout camp has impacted their lives reminded us of why this work profoundly matters.

We transitioned from one milestone to the next—four girl delegates from GSWISE were selected among 16 Girl Scouts nationwide to represent Girl Scouting internationally at the 69th Commission on the Status of Women at the United Nations. These delegates stood alongside global leaders to discuss gender equality and brought these insights back to Wisconsin.

Another group of Girl Scout delegates demonstrated incredible dedication and advocacy during our Movement's first-ever special National Council Session, where delegates approved a membership dues increase to modernize and sustain our programs and provide additional council support.

We're evolving too. This year, we secured funding for a paid cultural learning experience for 50 high school Girl Scouts to Washington, D.C. in 2026—creating opportunities that might be out of reach for many families. This experience comes in tandem with the introduction of our new "She Will" campaign, which highlights the journey of Girl Scouts from young girls to accomplished community leaders.

This growth and these exciting opportunities don't happen without you. Your belief in our community, your investment in girls' futures, and your partnership in this mission make our impact tangible. We can't wait for what's in store.

GSWISE Community Outreach Program

We're committed to making the Girl Scout experience accessible, welcoming, and rooted in the communities we serve.

GSWISE's Community Outreach team partners with schools and community organizations across Milwaukee, Racine, and Kenosha counties to bring Girl Scouting directly to girls where they are. Through staff- and volunteer-led bilingual programming, Girl Scouts engage in outdoor learning, STEM, life skills, and entrepreneurship in ways that honor their cultures, languages, and lived experiences. Programs are offered through both series-based and troop-based models, guided by trained staff who reflect and support the communities they work alongside.

Community Outreach in Action: Girl Scout Yamileth Leads With Care and Courage

Girl Scouting creates space for girls of all ages to build confidence, strengthen leadership skills, and care for one another.

At Kenosha School of Language, Girl Scout Yamileth embodied the Girl Scout Law by showing up as a supportive leader and trusted peer during her after-school program. While working on a STEM-based roller coaster activity, Yamileth naturally moved between English and Spanish, making sure everyone understood the instructions and felt included. She stepped in to translate, explain, and encourage younger Girl Scouts, offering support because she noticed it was needed, not because she was asked.

Later that year, Yamileth's leadership continued to shine when she led the flag ceremony at the school's Family Huddle. Standing confidently in front of the full assembly, she guided the ceremony with pride and presence, drawing on her own courage and sense of responsibility as a Girl Scout.

This unique experience brought together key community leaders from all industries with a cohort of Girl Scouts for leadership workshops, group mentorship, and networking. Both mentors and Girl Scouts enjoyed classic camp activities, including archery, rock climbing, fishing, and canoeing. The camp brought guidance, bold examples, and connection to our older Girl Scout community.

Girl Scouts who earn their Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards are making a lasting impact in their communities—and beyond.



Go for Gold: Girl Scout Ruby S.

The Gold Award is the most prestigious award in Girl Scouting. To earn the Gold Award, a Girl Scout spends 80+ hours identifying an issue in their community, drafting a plan to address its root cause, and leading a team of volunteers to implement it. When the project is complete, the Gold Award Girl Scout and their team have made a sustainable impact on the world that lasts beyond just their involvement. Gold Award Girl Scouts, like Ruby S. from Troop 8599, are true changemakers.



Ruby's Gold Award project, "Effect Electronics Have on Children," focused on excessive screen time among children and promoted outdoor activities. Her project provided kids with opportunities to explore nature, exercise, and develop social skills. She created backpacks filled with engaging outdoor games, scavenger hunts, and other interactive materials that were donated to the Urban Ecology Center (UEC). Ruby also led a summer camp in her neighborhood and conducted workshops at the UEC. Her activity backpacks remain available at the UEC, and their new facility will also feature her backpacks, further embedding the project into the community's outdoor learning initiatives.

"While earning my Gold Award, I learned how to improve my communication with community members," said Girl Scout Ruby. "Reflecting on my work, I now find it inspiring to know I made a difference. This has further inspired my interest in becoming an elementary education teacher too."

Commission on the Status of Women: From Global Advocacy to Local Impact



As four of only 16 Girl Scouts selected nationwide to represent Girl Scouts of the USA at the 69th Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), Girl Scouts Gemma, Hannah, Kailey, and Sophia spent months preparing before heading to the United Nations. At CSW, they advocated for critical issues affecting girls, connected with women and girls from around the world, and spoke up for a future where young female leaders are seen, heard, and empowered.

“During the conference, I felt truly hopeful. We were all working together to make the progress that needs to be made,” reflected Girl Scout Kailey.

“CSW opened my eyes to what’s possible—how much of a voice I have. Now that I am back, I’ve made it my mission to become as involved as possible and make my voice heard to address issues that I care quite a bit about. I’ll start doing this through my Girl Scout Gold Award project,” said Girl Scout Sophia. “I also learned more about public speaking, confidence, and networking. I know I can use these skills to advocate for good, and I’m excited for what’s to come.”



Bringing Our Mission to Life

Troop Camping Builds Courage and New Skills for Troop 10134

When Troop 10134 arrived at Camp Alice Chester for an overnight trip, emotions ranged from excitement to nervousness. Over the course of the weekend, the troop tapped into their courage and discovered their inner independence and resilience.

“Even if you’re a kid who hasn’t spent the night away from home, Girl Scouting gives you the space to do this in a safe and supportive environment with friends and trusted adults,” shared troop leader Elizabeth.

During the overnight, the troop stepped outside their comfort zone and tried new activities, like chopping vegetables and mixing ingredients for a campfire cake. They also made SWAPs (Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere) and tie-dyed t-shirts.

During downtime, the troop made fairy houses from leaves, sticks, glue, and recycling, unlocking their creativity and sense of play.

“We can schedule everything for kids, but give them random supplies and free time, and they’ll come up with their own activities,” reflected Elizabeth.

More magic happened at the rock-climbing wall. Though some were initially scared by the height, each Girl Scout climbed and cheered each other on.

“You could see their confidence growing with every climb,” recalled Elizabeth.

By the end of two hours, girls were scaling to the top ten times or more. Even those who didn’t make it to the top were already planning their return!



Girl Scout JaVeah Shows Up as a True Community Leader

When Girl Scout Junior, JaVeah, joined Troop 37889 in Racine, she discovered more than friendship and adventure; she found her voice as a leader.

While the multi-level troop was slower to get established, JaVeah’s enthusiasm never wavered. Over the summer, she transformed herself from a curious troop member into a confident Girl Scout advocate. It started at a recruitment table where she helped GSWISE staff, learning how to greet visitors and sharing what she loves about Girl Scouting.

Soon, JaVeah started frequently calling GSWISE recruiter Larissa: “Ms. Larissa—do you have any events today?” She began attending fall recruitment events, jumping in to lead activities with younger Girl Scouts with patience, kindness, and a sense of responsibility.

“She is very confident in what she does. She’s a hard worker,” shared proud Girl Scout mom and alum, JaQuasia. “She is always one step ahead. She likes challenging herself, and Girl Scouts has helped bring that out in her.”

Whether organizing a pet shelter fundraiser—one of her favorite Girl Scout projects—or setting up recruitment tables to talk to younger girls about her experience, JaVeah embodies the Girl Scout spirit: leading with character, serving her community, and inspiring others along the way.





